1.0 INTRODUCTION

The Land Transport Regulatory Authority (LATRA) is a Government Regulatory Authority established by the Act No. 3 of 2019. It is set to regulate Road Transport Services for goods and passengers (commuter buses, intercity buses, taxi cabs, ride hailing, ride sharing, motor cycles, motor tricycles and goods carrying vehicles); Railway transport services; and other forms of Land Transport like Cable Transport. According to section 5(g) of the Act, the Authority is mandated to monitor the performance of the regulated sectors. This report provides statistics on the performance of road sub sector for the period of January to March of the financial year 2021/2022 compared to the same period in 2020/2021.

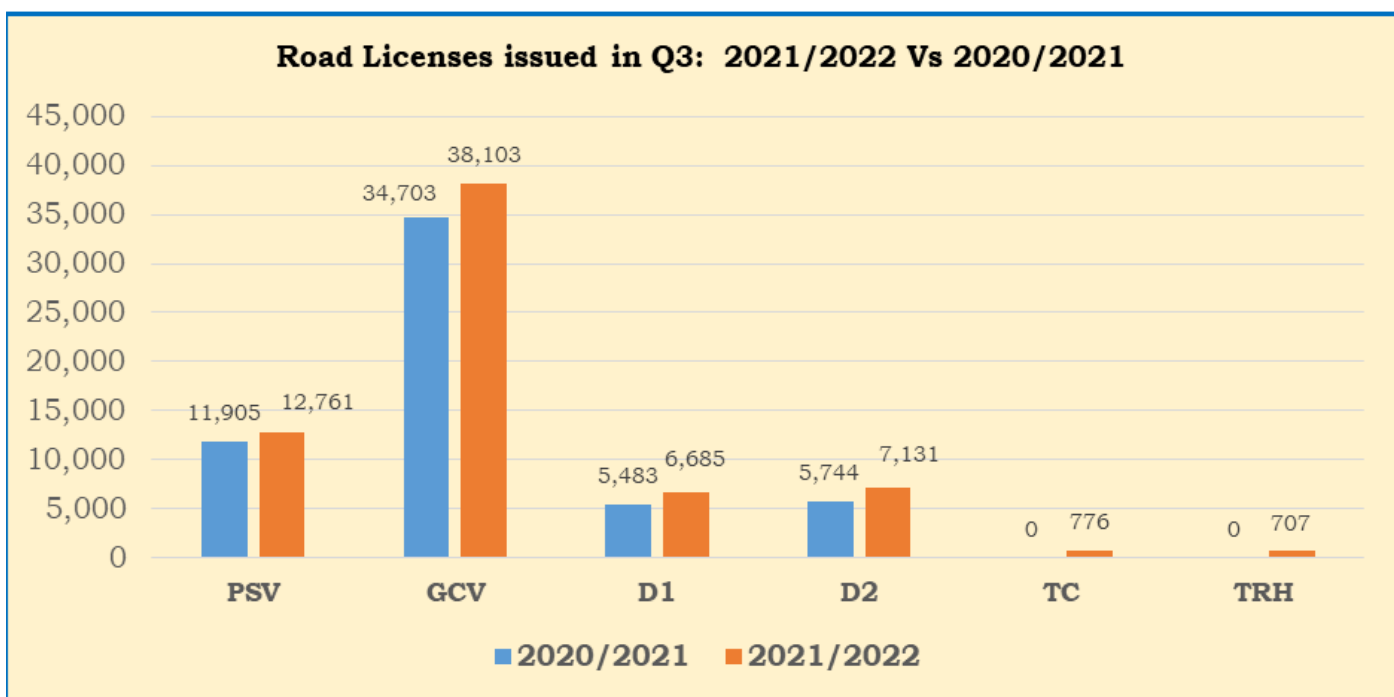
2.0 ROAD TRANSPORT SERVICES

The Authority continued issuing road transport service licenses for passenger and goods carrying vehicles to ensure that they meet licensing standards. To this effect, the Authority issued a total of 66,163 road service licenses equivalent to increase of 14.4% compared to the licenses issued in the similar quarter of the financial year 2020/21. Categorically, the issued road service licenses are as follows:-

3.0 PASSENGER SERVICE VEHICLES

The Authority issued a total of 12,761 licenses for passenger service vehicles (PSV), indicating an increase of 7.2 percent compared to 11,905 issued in the similar period in FY 2020/21. The licenses issued for PSV contributes about 19.3 percent of the total issued licenses.

Figure 2: Licenses for Passenger Service Vehicles per category

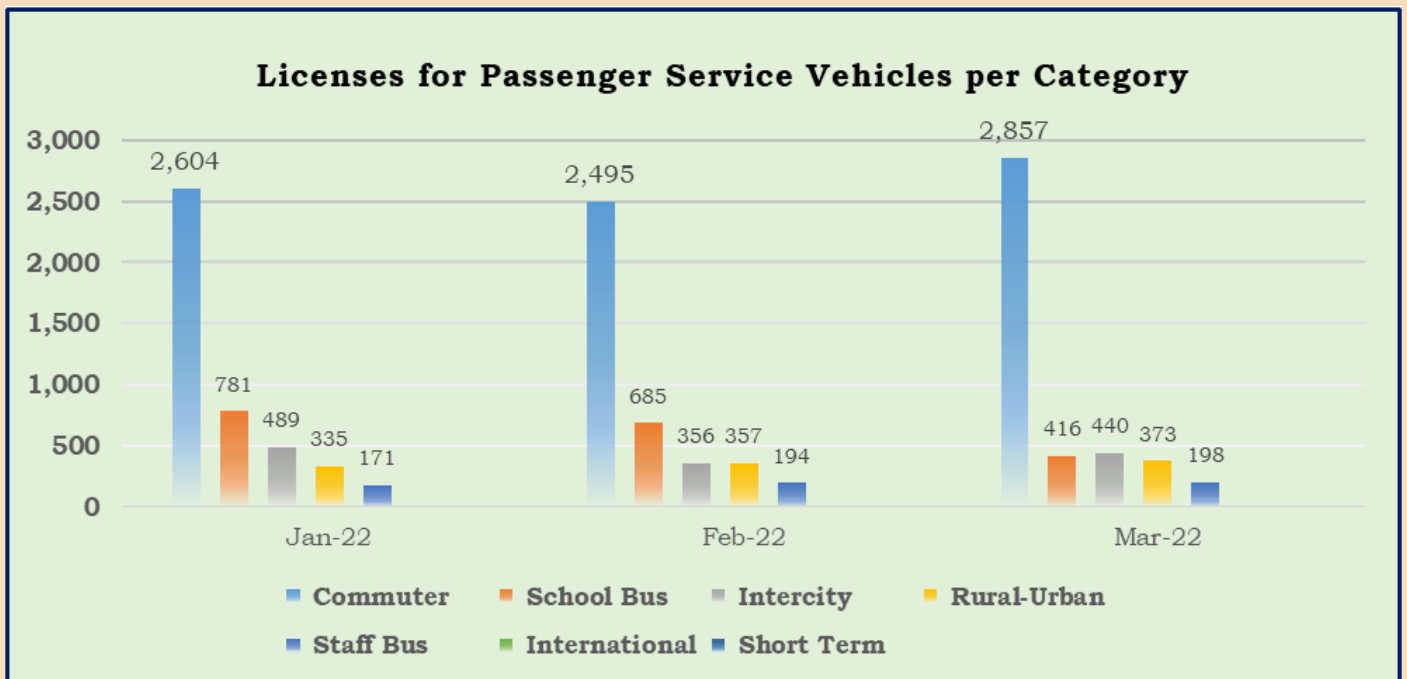
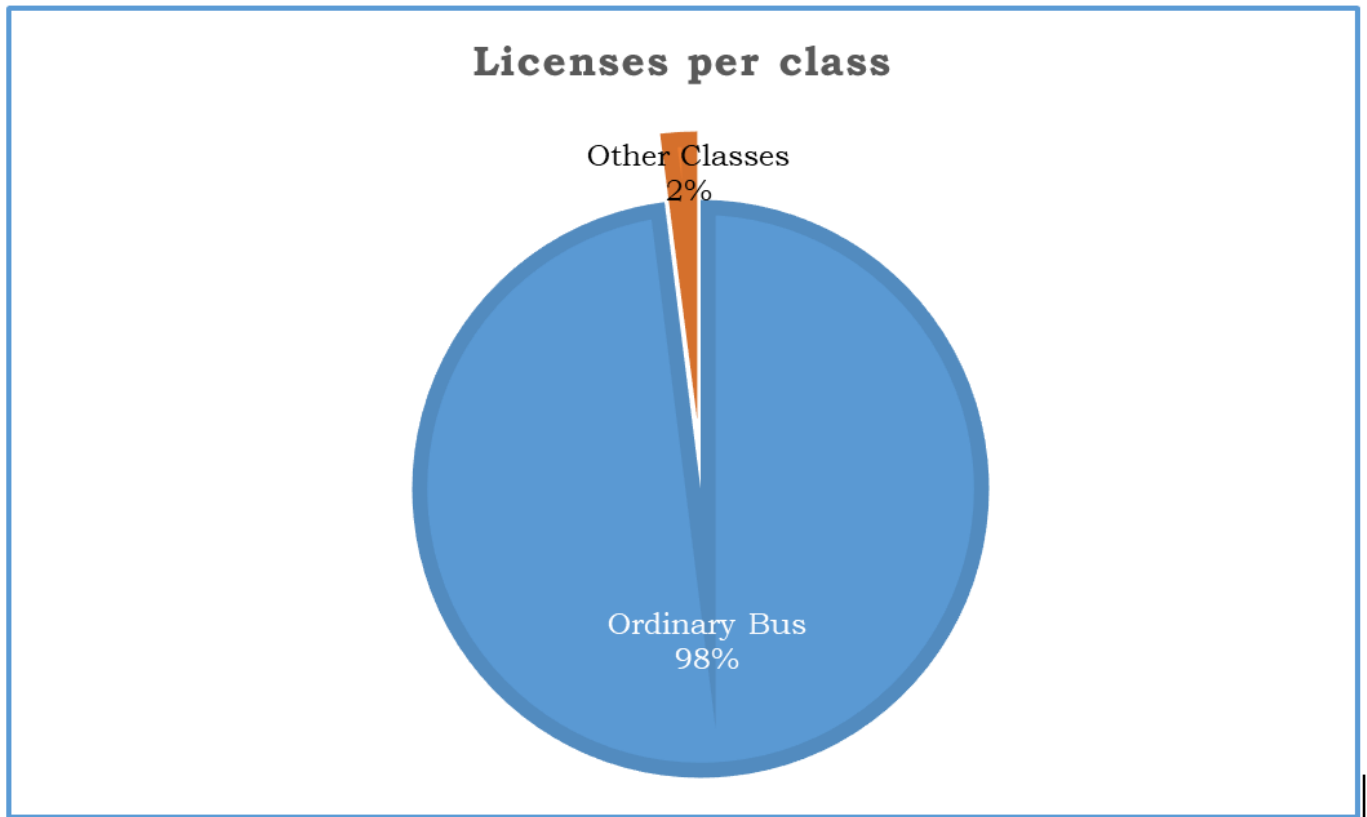

Figure 3: Licenses for Passenger Service Vehicles per class of service



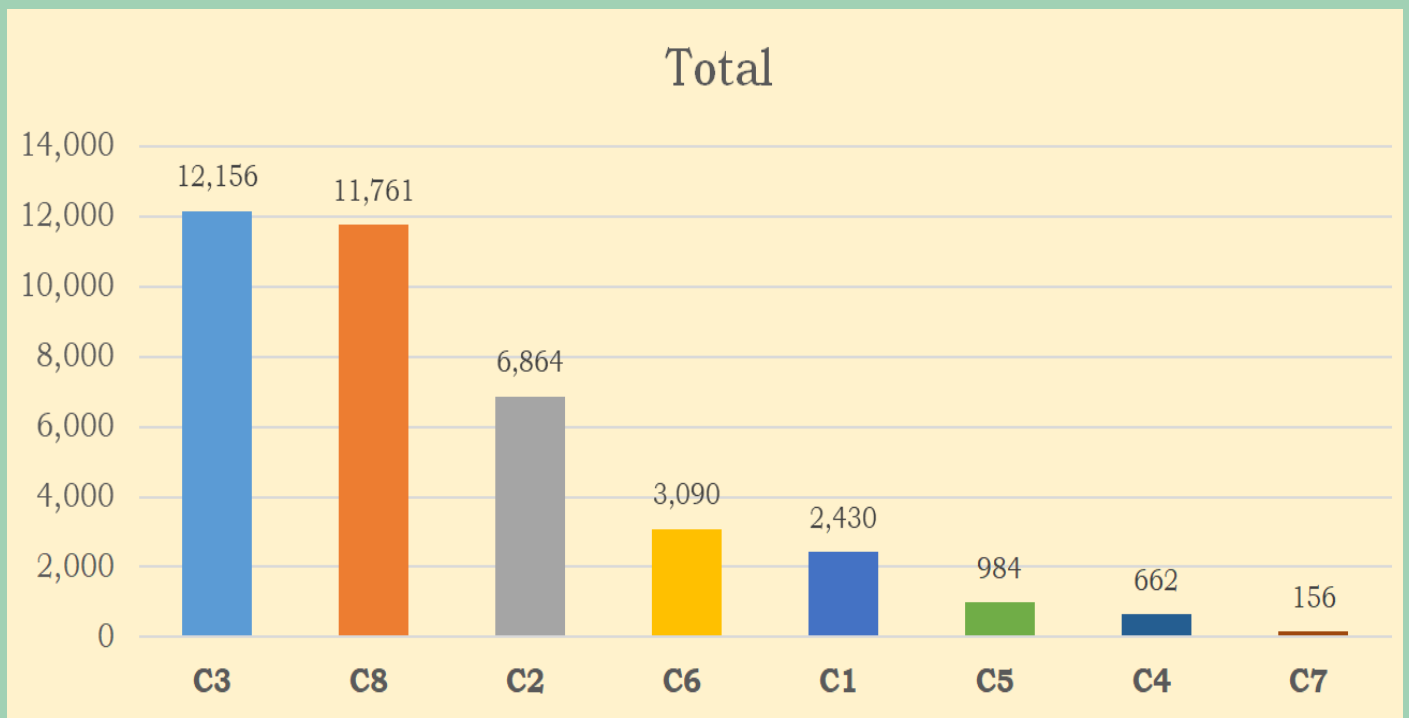
4.0 GOODS CARRYING VEHICLES

A total of 38,103 licenses were issued for goods carrying vehicles (GCV) reflecting an increase of 9.8 percent compared to 34,703 licenses issued during the similar period between January to March, 2021. The licenses issued for GCV contributes about 57.6 percent of the total issued licenses.

Figure 4: Licenses issued per carrying capacity



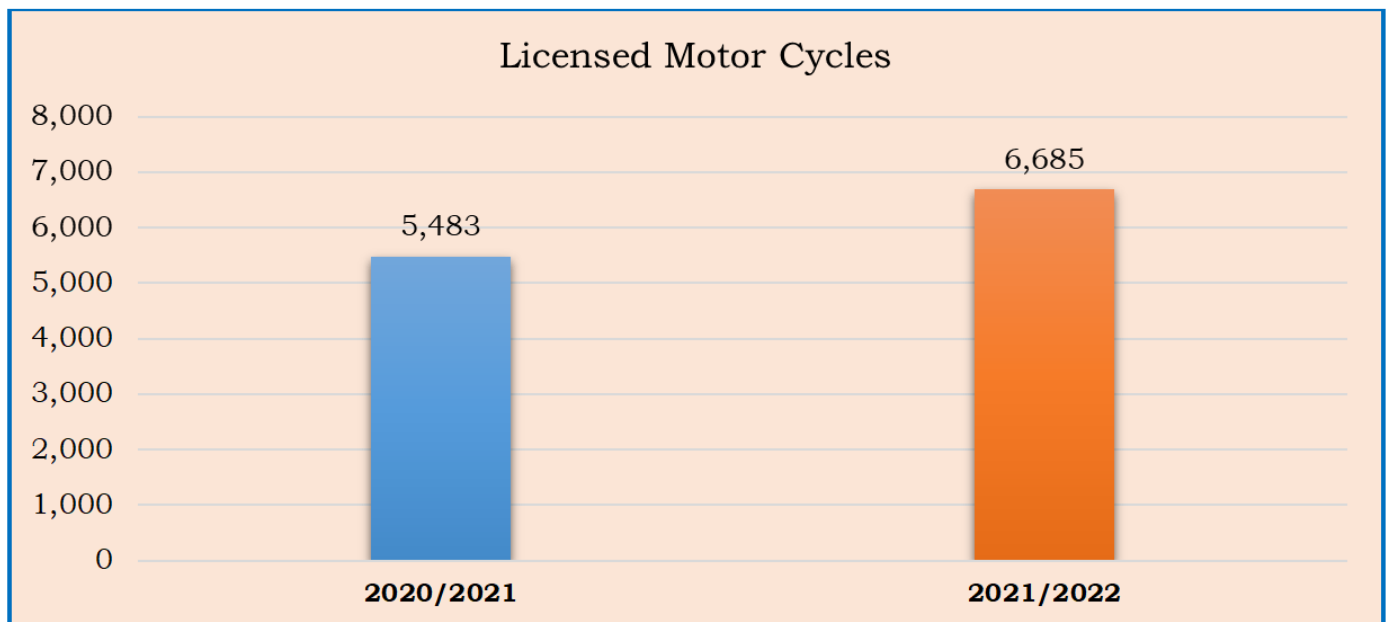
5.0 MOTORCYCLES AND TRICYCLES



5.1 MOTORCYCLES

The Authority issues a total of 6,685 licenses (D1) for motor cycles, being an increment of 21.9 per cent compared to a total number of 5,483 licenses issued during the similar period of the previous financial year.

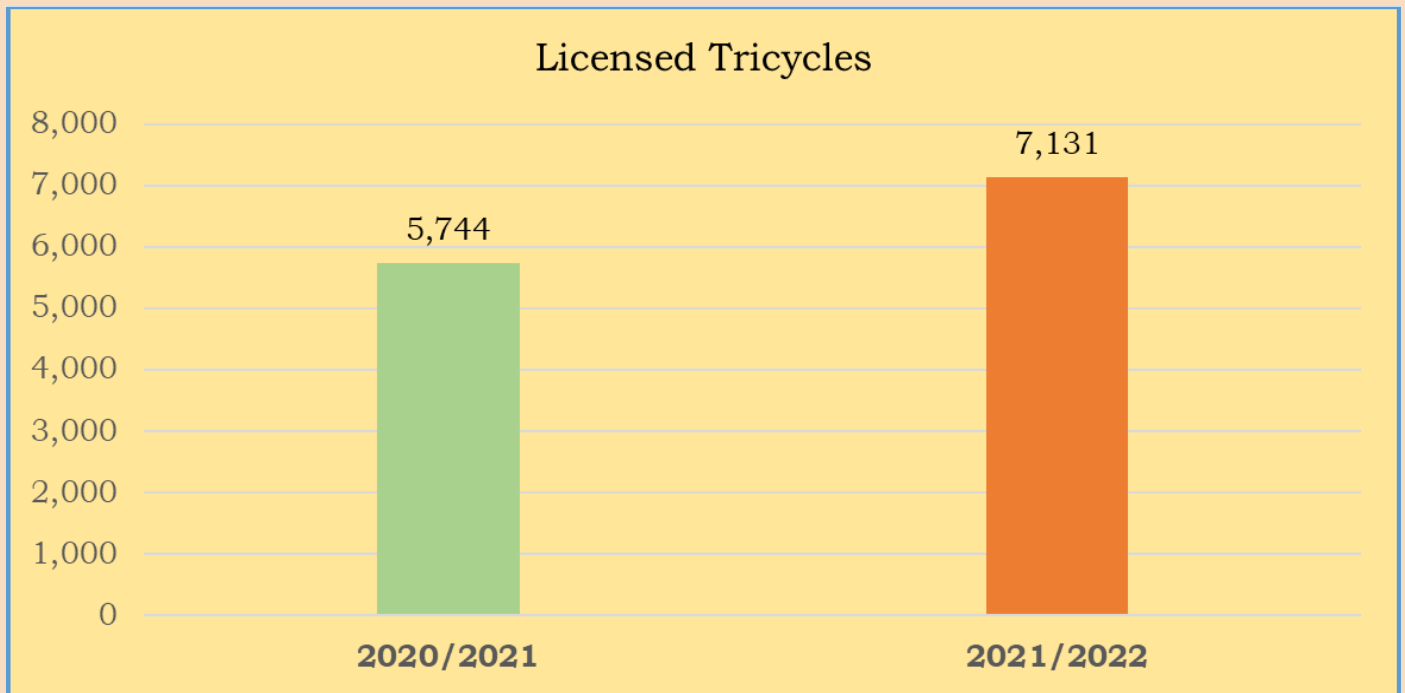
Figure 5.1: Licenses issued to motorcycles



5.2 TRICYCLES

During the period under review the Authority issued a total of 7,131 Licenses (D2) for motor tricycles, recording a growth of 24.1 percent when compared to a total of 5,744 licenses issued in similar period last financial year. Licenses issued to tricycles contributes about 10.8 percent of the total licenses issued during the period under review.

6.0 TAXI



6.1 Taxis (Conventional)

The Authority issues a total of 776 licenses for, conventional taxis, contributing about 1.2 percent of the total licenses issued during the period under review. Conversely, there were no licenses issued for such services in the previous years to cater for comparison analysis. Private transport service is a new regulated service.

6.2 Taxis (Ride Hailing)

During the reporting period, the Authority issued a total of 707 licenses for ride hailing taxi services, being 1.1 percent of the total issued road service licenses. Likewise there were no licenses issued for such services in the previous years to cater for comparison analysis as it is one of the new regulated service category.

More details of the issuance of licenses are provided in Table 3 and Figure 2 below.

7.0 DRIVERS REGISTRATION

The authority has is conduction registration of the drivers for the purpose of certifying their competence, skills and knowledge



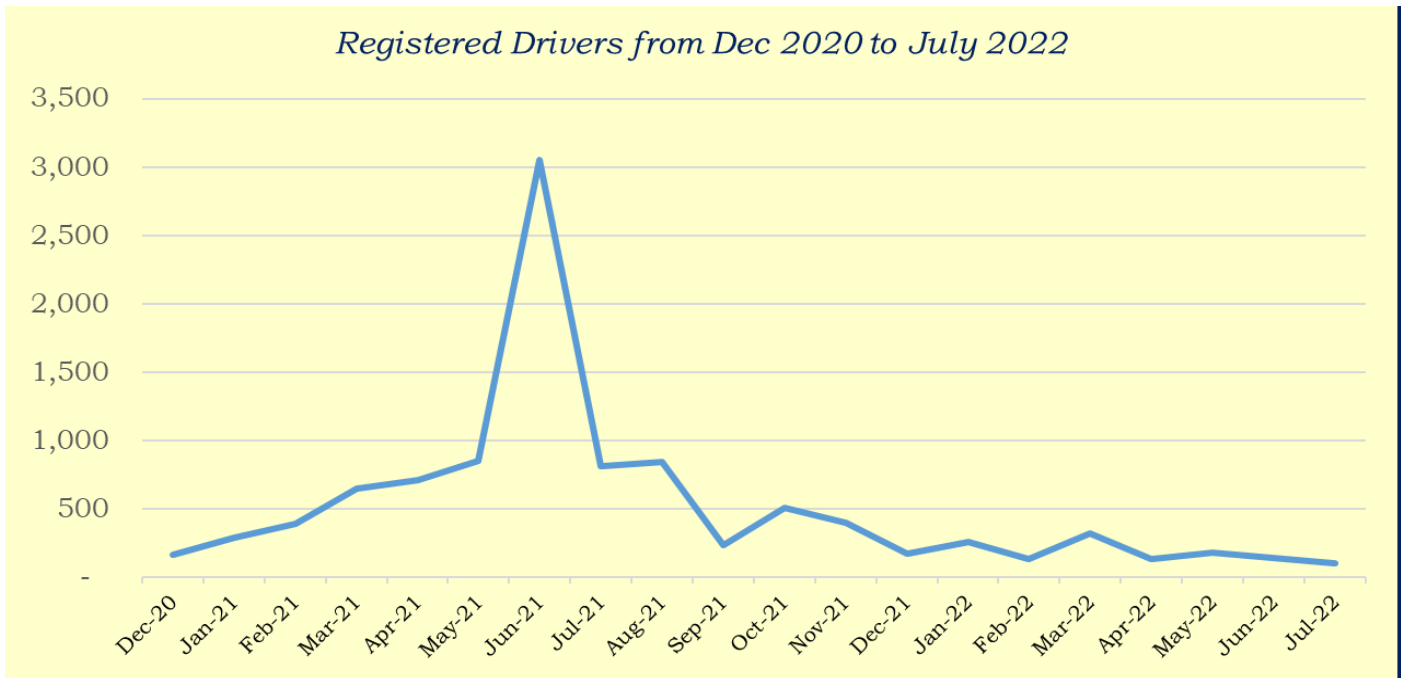
7.1 Total Registered Drivers
