Dar es Salaam. Mamlaka ya Udhibiti Usafiri Ardhini (Latra) inatarajiwa kuanzia leo kutangaza orodha ya watoa huduma wa tiketi mtandaon wa mabasi waliofanikiwa kuunganisha mfumo wao na wa Serikali.

Kwa mujibu wa Latra, watoa huduma ambao mfumo wao wa tiketi mtandaon hausomani na mfumo ya Serikali hawataruhusiwa kuendelea na shughuli wanazofanya.

Hatua hii inakuja baada ya Latra kutoa notisi ya miezi miwili ikiwataka watoa huduma wote wa tiketi mtandaoni kuun-

ganisha mifumo yao na Mfumo wa Tiketi za Usafiri wa Latra pamoja na Mfumo wa Usimamizi wa Mashine za Kielektroniki za Kodi wa Mamlaka ya Mapato Tanzania (EFDMS) kabla ya leo.

Mkuu wa Kitengo cha Mawasiliano Latra, Salum Pazzi alisema timu ya wataalamu inaendelea kukamilisha uhakiki wa watoa huduma waliokidhi vigezo.

"Huduma za mabasi zitaendelea kama kawaida, lakini kuanzia leo tutachapisha orodha ya watoa huduma waliothibitishwa. Orodha hii itasambazwa kwa waendeshaji wa usafiri, kampuni zilizotambuliwa pekee

**Z**ALIDI ya watu 38 wamefariki dunia na wengine 30 kujeruhija katika ajali iliyotokea eneo la Sabasaba, Kata ya Same, wilayani Same, mkoani Kilimanjaro.

Ajali hiyo iliyotokea mwishoni mwa wiki ilisababishwa na magari mawili kugongana uso kwa uso na kusababisha kulipuka moto ulioteketeza roho za watu hao na wengine kubaki na vilema vyaa maisha.

Tunaungana na Rais Dk. Samia Suluhu Hassan kutuma salamu za pole kwa Mkuu wa Mkoa wa Kilimanjaro, Nurdin Babu, ndugu, jamaa na marafiki wa marehemu.

Kama hiyo haitoshi, Rais Dk. Samia aliwakumbusha madereva kuzingatia hotuba yake aliyitoa Juni 27, mwaka huu, alipohitimisha shughuli za Bunge la 12, waendeleee kuzingatia kwa umakini mkubwa sheria za usalama barabarani na kulitaka Jeshi la Polisi kuzidi kusimamia kikamilifu sheria hizo.

Japokuwa ajali hazina kinga, tunawasisitiza madereva kuongeza umakini barabarani kwa kuzingatia sheria zilizopo kuepusha simanzi na vifo vitokanavyo na ajali.

Madereva wanapaswa kutii matakwa ya sheria kwa kuendesha mwendo kulingana na maelekezo ya vibao viliviyowekwa barabarani yakiwemo matuta.

Hata hivyo, inasikitisha kukuta baadhi ya madereva wakiendesha magari kwa mwendo kasi zaidi halii inayodhihirisha wanapuza maelekezo ya vibao hivyo na matokeo yake kujikuta wakisababisha ajali zinazogharimu maisha ya watu na mali zao.

Japokuwa Jeshi la Polisi limesema kilichosababisha ajali iliyotokea wiki iliyopita ni kupasuka kwa tairi ambalo lilikuwa chanzo cha basi kubwa la abiria kuyumba na kwenda kuligonga gari dogo, hivyo moto kulipuka na kuunguza baadhi ya watu.

Tunaendelea kuwasitisitiza madereva kuendesha magari kwa mwendo unaohitajika kisheria kutasaidia maisha ya abiria kubaki salama, kwani hata ajali zikitokea hazitasababisha athari kubwa kama iliyotokea Same au maeneo mengine nchini.

Pia, Jeshi la Polisi liongeze ukaguzi wa magari yote kuhakikisha usalama wa watumiaji wa vyombo hivyo wanaendelea kubaki salama.

Tunatambua juhudii kubwa za jeshi hilo zinazofanywa barabarani kudhibiti ajali, lakini mikakati hiyo iongezwe kwa kuwatoza faini kubwa baadhi ya madereva, kuongeza adhabu ya vifungo na kuzifutia leseni kampuni zenye mabasi yenye matukio mengi ya ajali.

Tunaamini kuchukuliwa kwa hatua hizo ikiwemo kutoa elimu kuhusu umuhimu wa kuheshimu sheria za usalama barabarani, kutapunguza au kumaliza ajali hizo kabisa.

## Two-bus crash toll rises to 39: Govt to cover funeral costs

THE death toll from the devastating head-on bus collision in Same District, Kilimanjaro Region has inched up to 39, after a critically injured victim succumbed to burn wounds in hospital.

Nundin Babu, the regional commissioner, said in a late interview yesterday that the newly succumbed passenger has been recognized by his relatives, though he did not have the name of the deceased at hand.

In an earlier press briefing, the RC had confirmed the deaths of 38 individuals who lost their lives on the scene upon collision impact and fire outbreak of the two buses involved in the disaster.

The Saturday evening crash shocked the nation's conscience, with President Samia Suluhu Hassan styling the sad event as a national tragedy, while the RC yesterday reiterated the government's commitment to cover full funeral expenses for those who died in the horrific incident.

The accident occurred in the Sabasaba area, just outside Same town, involving a Channel One Co. bus (T 179 CVL) and a Toyota Coaster mini-bus (T 199 EFX), colliding head-on and bursting into flames.

SACP Simon Malgwa, the regional police commander, attributed the cause of the crash to the Channel One bus, a Fusco model, suffering a front-right tyre burst and

## TRC begins SGR freight service with 700 tonnes

TRANSPORTATION of goods has entered a new stage as goods now leave Dar es Salaam in the morning and are delivered in Dodoma four hours later, the railway authorities exclaim.

Focus Sahani, the Tanzania Railways Corporation (TRC) director of transport services, made this affirmation here yesterday, highlighting the SGR freight ser-

vice logistical advantage over traditional road transport.

"Moving 700 tonnes by road would need more than 20 trucks," he said, noting that the SGR freight service simplifies bulk transport and slashes turnaround time significantly.

Urging the business community to embrace the new facility, he said that initial operation just conducted is only the beginning, as TRC plans to rapidly

increase the railway's capacity, to reach 1,500 tonnes and later up to 2,000 tonnes in one haul as infrastructure and operational capabilities expand.

"This kind of efficiency is a game-changer for time-sensitive cargo," he declared, focusing on the speed and dependability of the service.

TRC has ushered in a new era of logistics efficiency, officially launching its SGR

## Government lists 73 projects complying with carbon trading national framework

A TOTAL of 73 carbon projects have been initiated across the country, with 69 currently in various stages of registration, four already actively under implementation, since the government adopted revised carbon trading regulations came into effect he explained, showcasing tangible progress in the sector.

Hamad Yusuf Masunsi (pictured), the Union and Environment state minister in the Vice President's Office (VPO), made this affirmation after receiving an assessment report on carbon trading trends locally, in Dar es Salaam yesterday.

He said that Tanzania is strategically positioning carbon trading as a pivotal instrument in its fight against climate change, fostering national and international efforts to reduce greenhouse gas emissions.

Carbon trading regulations encourage participation from individuals, institutions and private firms as lately the government has strengthened regulatory oversight, he stated.

This robust framework includes the Carbon Trading Regulations established in 2022 (and amended in 2023), alongside the creation of the National Carbon Monitoring Centre (NCMC), he specified.

The NCMC plays a crucial role in project registration, facilitating effective monitoring and greenhouse gas verification, apart from conducting stakeholder education

ence collection, adding that the mining sector is a key contributor to domestic revenue.

He alluded to reminders by President Samia Suluhu Hassan concerning strengthening revenue collections to augment the country's efforts to become self-reliant in its development objectives.

He praised staff at the ministry and its affiliated institutions, attributing the surpassing of the target to their staff dedication and collaborative spirit. Unity and professionalism need to be fostered to expand the sector's contribution to the wider economy, he stated.

He listed major government agencies supervised by the ministry, like the Geological Survey of Tanzania (GST), the Tanzania Extractive Industries Transparency Initiative (TETI), the Mining Commission, the Tanzania Gemological Centre (TGC), asserting that staff in these agencies and in the ministry are all part of this success and must work together. Inter-institutional synergy is vital, he stated.

He praised the government's strategic decision to begin purchasing gold as an aspect of currency reserves, affirming that it is a crucial move that strengthens the country's financial security.

It is a significant shift from previous years when gold reserves were not prioritized while the central bank is now tasked with purchasing 20 percent of the gold they obtain from BoT to boost currency stability.

The ministry's leadership would make visits to meet with staff in the various ministerial institutions to hear the challenges they face and how to address them, he said, asking civil servants to actively participate in the upcoming national elections.

Dr Janeth Lekashingsha, chairperson of the Mining Commission, stressed on the spirit of unity, urging workers to build strong relationships and embrace a culture of exercise for improved health and productivity.

Ramadhan Lwamo, the commission's executive secretary, underscored the importance of physical fitness in boosting workplace performance, at an event celebrating achievements, promoting staff well-being and institutional solidarity.

causing the driver to lose control of the vehicle.

The bus veered into the opposite lane, leading to the fatal collision with the mini-bus, he explained, while the RC was yesterday briefing on the convening of the disaster committee chaired by a deputy permanent secretary at the Prime Minister's Office.

The committee will receive a working assessment of the incident so that the government can assist with funeral arrangements once the bodies arrive to respective places, he explained.

There will be no mass burial and funerals will be conducted after DNA-assisted identification of the crash victims, he emphasized, stressing the vital exercise of individual identification.

"We cannot bury them together because when the DNA results come, relatives will claim the bodies. We have tagged each of the gravely burned victims and they will be handed over to their families on the basis of the DNA results," he elaborated.

DNA results are anticipated for Wednesday and bodies then released for burial on Thursday, where the government will assist with transportation of the deceased, he affirmed.

Of the 39 victims, 33 bodies are being held at the KCMC zonal referral hospital in Moshi municipality, and six are at the Same District hospital.

Other businesses need to follow this example speed is complemented by significantly enhanced safety, he said.

With SGR cargo need not be hauled overnight on the road, he said, citing same-day delivery as reducing risks and preserving the quality of goods on delivery.

Joel Lauer, the Azania Group public relations director, confirmed the service's reliability firsthand, pointing at the firm's first shipment of 700 tonnes as indeed delivered

within four hours.

establish regional databases of operational and defunct factories. Such data, he said, would support strategic planning and the development of targeted industrial growth policies.

Dr Jalo also underscored the importance of strengthening the structured warehouse receipt system—a model he described as one of the most successful mechanisms for improving trade practices in the country.

He highlighted a shift in Tanzania's economic structure, noting that the country has historically relied on imported goods, including agricultural products.

However, with increased public and private investment—especially in agriculture—the trend is changing. The agriculture sector budget, he noted, rose from 29 billion to 108 billion, leading to higher productivity in key cash crops.

Dr Jalo said Tanzania now exports products such as rice to South Africa, contributing to increased national revenue.

He added that the country has developed a surplus of domestically produced goods, including reinforcement bars, cement and other materials that were previously imported at high cost.

To support this initiative, the minister called on trade officers to

Tanzania's trade and manufacturing sectors have seen respective growth rates of 4.8 percent and 7.2 percent, and the government aims to push both to 10 percent as part of its strategy to transition the country to an upper-middle-income economy.

Also speaking at the conference, Deputy Permanent Secretary in the President's Office - Regional Administration and Local Government (PORALG), Sospeter Ntwale, urged local leaders to take a proactive role in business supervision and support small-scale entrepreneurs by improving the business environment.

He called for visionary leadership and strategic planning at the grassroots level, aligning local priorities with the goals outlined in the newly launched government manifesto.

Morogoro Regional Administrative Secretary, Musa Ally Musa, emphasized the need for stronger collaboration between traders and farmers to harmonize efforts and boost production.

Morogoro Regional Commissioner, Adam Malama, called on the Ministry to designate Morogoro as a national hub for crop value addition, noting the region's high production of both food and cash crops, including spices.

and awareness campaigns, he said.

The carbon trading landscape is also expanding to Zanzibar, as environmental authorities have begun receiving carbon project applications, following the approval of Zanzibar's Carbon Trading Control and Management Regulations in 2025, he said.

As of May 2025, four companies had expressed strong interest in executing such projects, with two submitting detailed concept notes, indicating a growing momentum in the Isles, he affirmed.

The assessment committee, tasked with evaluating Tanzania's carbon trading environment, has put forward key recommendations to enhance efficiency, with its report advocating extensive public education on carbon trading, he stated.

It also underlines the development of comprehensive training guidelines at various stakeholder levels, along with establishing stakeholder discussion forums, he said.

The committee's insights focus on implementation of carbon trading

as likely to be significantly bolstered by reviewing existing regulations, while improving the National Carbon Registry, he said.

It also stresses the need to devise a specific public education strategy, enhancing data management systems and actively encouraging private sector involvement, he stated.

The assessment underscores Tanzania's immense potential to leverage carbon trading benefits through strategic projects spanning diverse sectors, including the standard gauge railway (SGR). Dar es Salaam Rapid Transit (DART) buses, renewable electricity generation and widening natural gas domestic energy use.

Other areas include systematic forestry activity, green agriculture, green buildings, education, mining, waste management and the burgeoning blue economy, he explained further.

Carbon trading is therefore set to become a vital mechanism, not just for environmental protection, but also for fostering sustainable development and economic growth across the country, the minister added.
